“STRESS”

Dear Friends:

We all have it. We all experience stress, unless perhaps you are under 7 years old. Stress is a definite part of life, and it seems more prevalent around the Christmas season. There is the shopping, the traffic, the parties, and last but not least family stress.

What are we to do? A recent article talks about “spiritual” solutions. I put spiritual in quotation marks because the word has developed into meanings that are very modern.

It is often said today that people are “spiritual” but not religious. What does that mean? That means, apparently, that people have some belief in God, some kind of prayer life, but they are not associated with a religion, a denomination, or a Church.

So it seems the modern approach is that it is “OK” to be spiritual and have some kind of relationship with God, but it is not really “OK” to belong to a Church or believe in a set of doctrines. That is a simplification, but that is my reading of the modern American faith situation. Therefore you have people who see no need for a Church “building” and a growing group of people who reply “none” when asked what religion or denomination they belong to.

How does this relate to stress? Well, I feel people can use faith to deal with stress. Therefore the “spiritual” people are turning to alternative methods of stress reduction. Rather than attending Church and praying to deal with stress, people apparently are using music, exercise or alternative spiritual practices such as yoga.

There is no easy answer to deal with stress. We know stress is a part of life – it will always be there. But my opinion is that stress doesn’t happen in a vacuum. It seems to me that it is more healthy to deal with stress with others of a similar philosophy of life and beliefs. I would say that the Church can be a place of prayer and relaxation and, importantly, fellowship. I think all of these are good for stress reduction.
