Dear Friends:

If we look at any modern TV show, or check out any websites on the internet, it is likely we too will lose our sense of balance and serenity.

Sure, we can get upset about many things. There is certainly plenty of problems in the world. That's partly the result of a 24-hour news cycle that bombards us with the latest issues in which we can lose our sleep over. Injustice is out there, as always: and injustice must be exposed and dealt with. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ consistently spoke out against injustice. We must do the same.

But our efforts at changing the world must always come from an internal sense of peace and confidence. Any effort to effect change in society will only come when we are always committed to change and improve ourselves. And any desire to change society <u>must</u> be accompanied by a very healthy and vital sense of humility. How can we demand change of others when we refuse to change ourselves? Humility, true humility, is essential to any effective and engaging personality. To put it another way: We may take our favorite cause seriously, but we should never take ourselves seriously.

But inner peace should always be part of our life in Christ. Outrage and anger have their place, but we cannot be consumed by them. If we do not have any inner peace, where are we to go for rejuvenation and recharging?

Jesus Christ was concerned with social justice and society's problems. But he was also concerned with teaching, healing, love, and prayer. These are all part of a balanced and giving life. If we are called to imitate Jesus Christ (which we are) we need to be balanced like Him. Jesus Christ was filled with inner peace and He showed everyone the way to peace. That is what we should do.
