**"SPANISH MASS"**

Dear Friends:

*I just want to share with you my experience with saying the Spanish Mass in Dover at St. Charles Borromeo in recent years.*

*I had been saying a Spanish Mass at my previous assignment in St. John's in Goshen for four years. In that parish there was a Spanish-Speaking Deacon who said the homily. It was a rewarding and challenging experience. People say, "Oh you must be fluent in Spanish." I respond, "no, I just read the prayers."*

*Then I moved to Amenia, and the experience was over. That was until I learned that Bishop Peter Byrne had been assigned to Dutchess County. He began a Spanish Mass in St. Charles in Dover on Sundays at 6 pm (he is fluent in Spanish). I told him I would be happy to fill in for him if he could not make it, since I am only 10 miles away. Soon, he was calling me to cover for him.*

*Bishop Byrne had an accident where he broke his arm earlier this year. So then for a while I was filling in much more frequently. I was happy to do it, since the community in Dover is a very warm and friendly one.*

*One problem I faced was the homily, or sermon, since my Spanish is very poor. So what I do is deliver a few basic ideas, employing help from some of the English-speaking parishioners. Somehow, I manage to get through, and I ask at the end if the people understood me. They are very kind. A sense of humor is very helpful in these situations.*

*The Masses have a consistent crowd of between 70 to 100 enthusiastic people. They provide their own music, with a distinctive Spanish flair. The people are extremely friendly and love to participate in the Mass. The population is very young, with families and children.*

*Whenever I go to this Mass, I think of the enormous pressure that these people are under. Having to provide for their families, and having a limited understanding of the language, must be a very daunting experience. It is clear that their strong faith is a very great help in their daily life.*
